

## Pacific Rundum receives SBTi approval for Greenhouse Gas Emissions Reduction Targets

Pacific Rundum Co., Ltd. (based in Toyama; President and CEO Shinichiro Susukida) is pleased to announce that its greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions reduction targets have been approved by the Science Based Targets initiative (SBTi).



The SBTi is a joint initiative of the former CDP (Carbon Disclosure Project), the United Nations Global Compact, the World Resources Institute (WRI) and the World Wide Fund for Nature (WWF) to define and promote best practice in emissions reductions and net-zero targets in line with climate science.

SBTi has confirmed that Pacific Rundum's 2030 climate targets are consistent with the level of decarbonization required to meet the goals of the Paris Agreement, namely, to limit global warming to less than 2°C above pre-industrial levels and work toward limiting it to 1.5°C.

### Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Emissions Reduction Targets

Scope of emissions	Definition	2030 target
Scope1	Direct GHG emissions from industry (typically fossil fuel combustion and industrial processes)	50% reduction in GHG emissions (Scope 1 + 2) relative to 2018 levels
Scope2	Indirect emissions associated with use of electricity, heat and/or steam from external suppliers	
Scope3	Indirect emissions other than Scope 1 and Scope 2	Quantify emission levels and strive to reduce same
